

# **Foxwarren Museum**

The Foxwarren Museum is a fantastic place for people of all ages to stop in and is located right beside the beautiful Foxwarren Memory Garden that is full of colourful flowers, garden ornaments, and over 1000 memorial stepping stones dedicated to the past residents of Foxwarren. The Foxwarren Museum is dedicated to the pioneer women of Foxwarren and inside the museum there are displays of a pioneer woman's home and all of the tools she would use every day. The Foxwarren Museum is located in the old Saint George's Anglican Church, where the community people attended church services and other religious events. Early pioneers built St. George's Anglican church in 1906 and was originally located northeast of Snake

Creek on land donated by J. Herbert Hodgson. The building is 119 years old but it was relocated to the town of Foxwarren in 1921 where it served as the community Anglican church until it eventually had its last service on April 26th, 1995 when it closed. In 1993, the Foxwarren Historical Society was formed. The goal of this society was to preserve old buildings, document historic events, record oral history, and develop a museum in the village. The Historical Society also wanted to encourage activities to increase tourism in the community. After the closure of Saint George's Anglican church, the Foxwarren Historical Society took over the building and turned it into the Foxwarren Museum. After a few years of hard work from the Foxwarren Historical Society and volunteers, the museum, dedicated to pioneer women of Foxwarren, was officially opened on May 20th, 2000. Shortly after opening, the museum building was moved across town to its current location, making it easier for visitors to find. Over the years, the Foxwarren Historical Society faced challenges, the passing of board members and people with the knowledge of Foxwarren being the greatest. It makes the work of our summer students more important than ever to capture the stories and the oral history of Foxwarren. The museum was closed for almost 2 years during the pandemic, during which time social media became more important than ever to keep interest in the museum. While visitors to

the museum have not yet returned to prepandemic levels, weekly activities planned throughout the summer are working to bring visitors back to Foxwarren Museum and Memory Garden. Farmers' Markets, Kids Activity Days, Anniversary Garden Parties, and Joe Plumb Day, celebrating a beloved business, are just a few of the regular activities happening throughout the summer and always bring together people sharing their stories of Foxwarren. The Foxwarren Museum is open Monday to Friday from 9 am to 4:30 pm throughout the summer or by appointment at other times. The museum appreciates all who visit and share their personal stories that involve the wonderful village of Foxwarren!

# Miniota Time Capsule Opening

Where have 25 years On Wednesday, gone? July 23rd, 2025, the Village of Miniota Time Capsule was opened in the community park with approximately 60 citizens in attendance. In 2000, a committee was formed to build a cairn which would contain a time capsule of objects submitted by the community. The committee was comprised of Russell Howard, Don Forsyth, Lloyd Oliver, Bill Mossop and Edward Lelond. Sadly all but one of these gentlemen have passed away. The committee selected a stone which lay between the property of the Trout farm and the Armitage farm on the edge of the valley. It was brought to town and the cement base and capsule created. The inscription reads: Village of Miniota Centennial 1900-2000 Preserving the Past Looking to the Future Dedicated July 23, 2000 And so it was that the capsule was to

be opened 25 years later to the day. Linda Clark welcomed everyone giving a bit of the history and others in the crowd also shared their knowledge of the event. Following the opening of the time capsule, the items which had been encased were on view for all to see. Lynne Cornish had composed an article on the Miniota community and she read that out to those in attendance.

Cake cutting was done by Barry and Lynne Cornish and Edward Lelond. A few brought new articles to be encased once again, and so the Time capsule articles will be left on display at the Miniota Municipal Office until the end of September, and citizens are invited to drop off new articles. An evening will be held in the fall and the capsule will be sealed for a second time, with the idea that it will be opened a second time on July 23, 2050.
