

# Moose Defenseman Dawson Barteaux Eyes Full-Time Role With Hometown Team in 2025

Manitoba Moose Defenseman Dawson Barteaux aims for a full-time role in third season with his hometown team.

The Winnipeg Jets organization is filled with intriguing storylines across every level of its development system from the early stages in the ECHL with the Norfolk Admirals, all the way up to the NHL, where star goaltender Connor Hellebuyck is making headlines as a frontrunner for the Hart Trophy as the league's Most Valuable Player.

Amid the spotlight on big names and major accolades, there are also compelling narratives emerging from the AHL, where rising talents are quietly shaping the future of the franchise. One such storyline centers around defenseman Dawson Barteaux, whose journey with the Manitoba Moose is quickly becoming one to watch.

The former Dallas Stars sixth round pick the Manitoba joined Moose during the 2023-24 season and has enjoyed returning home to Manitoba. The Foxwarren native loves his home province and told The Hockey News during an exclusive interview, that he finds himself being a "huge advocate for Manitoba" when talking to people who haven't been.

Six Jets Crack The Athletic's Top-150 Players List On Thursday, The Athletic revealed its list of the Top-150 players currently serving in the NHL.

"I grew up watching the Moose, I'm very fortunate for them to reach out and give me this opportunity and yeah, it's obviously a great fit, I can't complain about being close to family, good for my wife," Barteaux explained "It's super easy moving to Winnipeg, I'm just a few hours away out in Riding Mountain National Park, where I kind of spend my summers, so it's great I'm just super proud to kind of be a part of the organization."

Barteaux is entering his sixth year of pro hockey with 33 points and a +2 rating through 143 AHL games played. At times last season, the 25-year-old didn't get into much game action and played in just 41 games.

He had a solid junior career with the Red Deer Rebels in the WHL, where he developed into a reliable two-way defenseman. After being acquired by the Rebels

from the Regina Pats in 2016, Barteaux quickly earned a key role on the blue line, known for his strong skating, puck-moving ability, and leadership qualities. Over parts of four seasons with Red Deer, he steadily improved his offensive production, highlighted by a 2018-19 campaign in which he recorded 34 points in 67 games. His strong play earned him recognition, and he was named an alternate captain before eventually serving as team captain.

"I have to give the team reason to keep me in the lineup, and I wasn't doing that enough but I'm really ready to push for a full time spot this year and be a guy that's really going to help the team." Barteaux said "Step one is doing whatever they need me to do, and be whatever kind of role they need me in and I'm just looking forward to getting it going and hopefully having a deep run this year."

Barteaux is a player that Moose fans can get behind as a hard-working local kid that grew up wanting to play for the local team and will be battling his hardest to make an impact. He adds interesting perspectives from his hockey travels

like witnessing first hand what hockey culture is like in the most Southern part of the U.S. in Texas when playing in the Dallas Stars farm system.

"Winters get colder in Winnipeg, obviously so it was a big transition, but nothing but good things to say about Austin and Dallas, just as an organization, they took the first swing at me, and I'm always appreciative of that," Bart noted "It's definitely different, as I feel like you grow up knowing the game here in Canada and the crowds are a bit different when they're cheering but Texas was one of the most electric fan bases I've played in front of, the community support there, they sell out a ton."

Before stepping back onto the ice, Barteaux is enjoying his offseason like many Manitoban boys, spending long summer days golfing, fishing with friends, and squeezing in training and skating whenever he can. But for those who know the heart of small-town hockey, his story goes beyond the stats and training routines.

Barteaux isn't just another prospect chasing an NHL dream but a living reminder of what community means when

the bright lights aren't watching. In towns like Foxwarren, where hockey is stitched into the fabric of everyday life, Barteaux carries more than just his own amhopes of every kid who laced up skates on frozen Manitoba ponds, every family who made the

#### Reconciliation Run: Honouring Survivors and Remembering Those Who Never Made it Home

"Movement is medicine," says Reconciliation Run director Tréchelle Bunn

"An event that began in honour of my Kunshi Mildred and Unkan Donald has now impacted hundreds of individuals across Turtle Island. Today and every day, let us honour Survivors and all of those who never made it home," shared Tréchelle Bunn following a Reconciliation Run in 2023.

The event traces its origins back to 2021, when Bunn organized a Healing Walk on behalf of her community to honour residential school survivors. That walk covered 26 kilometers, beginning with a ceremony at the site of the former Birtle Residential School and ending at her home community of Birdtail Sioux Dakota Nation.

Both of her grandparents had been survivors of the Birtle Residential School, making the journey deeply personal.

The Healing Walk had a powerful impact on the community. Since the 26 km distance closely aligned with a half-marathon, Bunn decided to carry the idea forward and establish the Reconciliation Run.

Today, the event is sanctioned by the Manitoba Runners' Association and continues to grow, bringing together participants from across the country in the spirit of healing, truth and reconciliation.



Lorne Molleken was born in Regina, Saskatchewan, and enjoyed a successful career as a professional goaltender before moving into coaching. 
ray Gurr who was the winner of a Q Country Harvest meal in the field. Due to the rainy day, the Gurr family enjoyed their meal in the house.

Don and Sandra Armitage have returned from a 3-week tour of Ontario and Pennsylvania. Sandra's ancestors were Mennonites who came from Germany to Pennsylvania in 1727, and Don's family were Quakers who came to PA from England in 1839. Both fami-

lies lived within an hour of each other and continued to live close by when they both moved to Ontario. The trail Don and Sandra took went to Ontario first, then to PA. After visiting Don's sister and husband near Kenora, and then friends in Arthur, Ont., the quest for ancestry began near Toronto. Several Armitage graves were located in Newmarket and Toronto, as well as great-great grandfather's residence. Sandra was able to locate the stone house of her great-great grandparents tucked away in a cemetery in Vaughn. It was built in 1849 and has now been nominated to be a heritage site. Sandra also made contact with a fellow descendant of her great-great-great grandfather Henry Snider, and had an interesting visit. The Heise Hill cemetery in Markham, contains the graves of many Heises, including two of the brothers who first came to Canada in 1804.

On they went to Pennsylvania, after seeing a Blue Jays game, and stopping at Niagara Falls. In PA, Don was able to enlist the help of a local historical society in Solebury Township in Bucks County, and one passionate historian graciously showed them around the area to see the old house, barn and grist mill that were built in 1750 by Samuel Armitage, as well as several other Armitage markers. Here they also

found ancestors in cemeteries and the original Quaker Meeting House. This area was only an hour away from New York City. Sandra was able to find the original farmstead of the first Heise born in North America, near Lebanon. The land that the Heises had farmed on seemed to be very fertile land and is now a dairy farm, with a great stand of corn along the lane. It is said that the Mennonites followed the trail of Black Walnut trees, and picked land where these trees flourished in both PA and Ontario. They recognized that where walnuts grew well, their crops would excel.

In Pennyslyvania, Sandra and Don also learned about the Amish people. When driving through the winding hills, it was not uncommon to see Amish horses and buggies on the road, or encounter farm stands selling fresh produce, flowers and baking such as 'Shoofly Pie''! There are many old

stone homes, in good repair, as well as big barns, similar to the Ontario barn style. It is said that the Mennonites were very good agriculturalists, and put much priority into the building of barns.

After leaving PA, the Armitage's stopped in Berlin, Ohio, also an Amish and Mennonite centre, then down to Newark, where they visited the Heisey Glass Factory. The Heisey that started this factory may be a relation, but it has not been directly traced yet. From there, there was a stop at a friend's in Columbus, then on the road back home. This trip has been on Don and Sandra's bucket list for some time, and it proved to be a successful one - lots of history discovered along the 11,000 k. It was truly an advantage that both families followed the same paths.


