### **Listening to You: What our Community Voices Surveys Tell Us**

Prairie View residents have been speaking up and we've been listening!

Through a series of surveys led by BMDDC, we're gathering valuable insights on housing, employment, travel, recreation and community life. This information helps us make informed decisions, plan for the future and ensure that Prairie View continues to be a great place to live, work and raise a family.

We are now preparing our seventh survey focused on Daycare Needs and we encourage everyone to take a few minutes to share their voice. Every response makes a difference. The survey can be found on the back page of The Outlook or under the Community Voices tab at www.myprairieview.ca.

#### **Housing & Employment**

Survey results show that most Prairie View residents are homeowners, with only a small number looking for specific housing such as in-town condos or two-bedroom homes. Employment responses revealed that many residents are already working locally, retired or running small businesses. Only a few indicated that they were actively seeking jobs, though one employer, Prairie Mountain Health (PMH), noted the need for nursing staff.

Recommendation: Promote housing availability and establish a job board to better connect employers and workers

#### **Travel Patterns**

Our Travel Patterns Survey revealed that most residents travel weekly or daily outside Prairie View for shopping, healthcare, work and recreation. The top destinations include Brandon, Russell, Virden and Shoal Lake. Many respondents said they would stay in Prairie View more often if more amenities, products and events were available locally.

Recommendation: Expand local retail, services and recreation opportunities to help reduce outbound travel and keep more activity close to home.

#### Recreation in Prairie View

When asked about recreation, residents expressed strong interest in arts, music, cultural events, sports and fitness activities and youth and senior programs. Suggestions included walking groups for seniors, open teen sports at schools, outdoor winter activities like tobogganing and family entertainment nights.

Barriers to participation included cost, limit-

ed program options and focus on daycare and lack of time. childcare needs. We'll

Recommendation:

Develop low-cost, accessible programs, increase advertising and scheduling and explore improving outdoor infrastructure such as trails.

#### **Community Belonging**

The Community Belonging Survey highlighted Prairie View's strong roots. Respondents, some who had lived here for more than 50 years, rated their sense of belonging a 7 through 10 out of 10, showing deep community ties. Favorite events included Canada Day, Fall Fest/Welcome Night and local teas and socials.

Residents shared that the Outlook newsletter, Facebook, word of mouth and bulletin boards are their preferred ways of receiving community information.

Recommendation:

Continue promoting inclusive events, encourage support groups and outreach and use multiple communication methods to reach everyone.

#### Coming Soon: Daycare Needs Survey

Our next survey will

focus on daycare and childcare needs. We'll be asking:

What ages need care? How many children need spots?

What times are most needed?

The results will help guide daycare expansion and ensure families have the support they need.

# Manitoba's Wage Subsidy Program: Helping Employers

Hiring and training new employees can be a challenge for businesses and organizations. To help with these costs, the Province of Manitoba offers a Wage Subsidy Program, designed to support employers while providing meaningful job opportunities for individuals entering or re-entering the workforce.

Through this program, employers can receive financial assistance to off-set the cost of on-the-job training for new hires. The subsidy must be approved before the employee is hired, and positions must provide at least 30 hours of work per week. Employers must also ensure that cur-

rent staff are not displaced.

The program is open to a wide range of employers, including private businesses, non-profits, community groups, Crown corporations, municipalities, tribal councils, and public health or education institutions. Eligible employees include individuals with a current or past Employment Insurance (EI) claim, or those who are unemployed or at risk of losing their job.

The amount and length of support vary depending on job requirements, skill development needs, and local labour market conditions. While overtime and vacation pay are not covered, the program provides a valuable way to build a stronger workforce while easing financial pressure for employers.


