



Foxwarren, Manitoba — On Sunday, August 25, the Foxwarren Arena, a cherished hub of community and sports in this small Manitoba town, suffered significant damage from powerful winds exceeding 150 km/h. The storm, which was a "bow echo," so-named because it's shaped like an archer's bow on radar, tore apart a large section of the arena's roof, leaving behind scattered debris and puddles of water inside the rink. The arena, a cornerstone of local culture and activity for 75 years, is now facing uncertainty.



The Foxwarren Arena has long been more than just a rink. Opened in the late 1940s, it has become a vital part of Foxwarren's identity and community life. Over the decades, the arena has been a training ground for many hockey players, including notable NHLers such as Ron Low, Pat Falloon, and Mark Wotton. These athletes honed their skills in the very building that now lies damaged.

Beyond hockey, the arena has also served as a venue for figure skaters, who have used its ice to perfect their routines and perform in local competitions. During the warmer months, the building transforms into a community center, hosting a range of activities from funerals and celebrations of life to vari-

ous social gatherings. The versatility and importance of the Foxwarren Arena make it a beloved fixture in the community.

The Impact of the Storm

The storm's damage was severe. High winds ripped off a substantial portion of the arena's roof, and photos taken by local residents show the extent of the destruction: debris scattered around the area and large pools of water inside the rink. The structural integrity of the building is not known at this time, the rink board is awaiting a full assessment from their insurance company and structural engineers to assess options and discuss the next steps. The focus right now is on securing the structure, safely removing debris and

awaiting details on the structural integrity of the building.


Community Resilience

Birdtail Country Museum Happenings

Stop in and see what we have at the Birdtail Country Museum!

The museum has multiple different artifacts on display with write-ups describing the items, their uses or the history behind them. We have an Indigenous display with artifacts loaned to us from Birdtail Sioux First Nation and other local artifacts neatly displayed. We have an old organ, dentist supplies, trophies, cameras, musical instruments and many more interesting items. Below is an example of a write-up included in our Sports display!

1920's Swimsuits

"In many ways, men's and women's swimsuits were nearly identical. Both were deep-cut ribbed wool tank tops over a snug fitting pair of shorts that were sewn in at the waistline.

The "skirt" of the swim-top came up from knee-length a few years before to around mid-thigh level. It was "too much" to raise the top any further, revealing men's personal parts. Instead, more suit material was removed from under the arms and around the back - supposedly making it easier to swim, but mostly to reveal more muscles."

Program Facilitator

Job Description

The Minds in Motion* program is a 2-hour program featuring exercise, socialization and mentally stimulating games for people living with early to moderate signs of dementia to enjoy with a family member or friend. The program runs for once a week for 8 weeks and repeats on a seasonal basis – fall, winter, and spring.

The Minds in Motion® Program Facilitator accepts the responsibility to oversee the program delivery, participant experience and volunteer management of the Minds in Motion® program team. This is a contract position that requires a 3-hour commitment, once per week for eight-weeks.

Shoal Lake Drop-in Centre is currently looking for a Program Facilitator.

Responsibilities

- Liaise between the Alzheimer Society of Manitoba, Shoal Lake Minds in Motion Committee, program
 participants, and program volunteers
- Provide a safe, stigma-free and fun-filled environment for program participants
- Provide emotional support and/or navigational assistance to participants, when needed
- Attend the annual Minds in Motion* development ½ day of training (October of each year)
- Maintain organization with program materials
- Execute program plans based on the participant group
- Communicate with the Shoal Lake Minds in Motion Committee and Senior Manager, Dementia-Friendly Communities regarding questions or concerns with participant experience and/or expectations, volunteers, or communitypartners
- Consult with the Senior Manager, Dementia-Friendly Communities when trends in participant experiences are noticed
- Confirm scheduling for volunteers
- Submit monthly invoices and receipts in a timely fashion

Functions

- Arrive 30 minutes prior to and remain 30 minutes following each programsession
- Transport weekly programming resources, educational information and fitness equipment; when required
- Prepare program volunteers for weekly facilitation assignments; identify and address areas of concern
- Maintain accurate data for participants attendance, participant experience and referrals forservice
 Debrief with the fitness leader and program volunteers on a weekly basis to determine participant experience and identify safety concerns
- Conduct and collect sessional data and assessment as requested by the Shoal Lake Minds in Motion Committee and Senior Manager, Dementia-Friendly Communities





Qualifications & Experience

- Professional and/or personal experience with the dementia journey and caregiverstress
- Minimum two years' experience working with volunteers, student practicums and community
 agencies (or a minimum of one year experience as a Minds in Motion®volunteer)

Manitoba Government Bans Cellphone Use in Classrooms



As a way to minimize distractions in schools, the

Manitoba government is banning the use of cellphones in the classroom starting this September, Education and Early Childhood Learning Minister Nello Altomare announced today.

"We want young people to be able to focus in class so they can learn more and feel confident. We know cellphones can be a real distraction for students – studies show it can take up to 20 minutes for a child to refocus on what they were learning once distracted," Altomare said. "These provincial guidelines will give teachers the tools they need to keep students focused and ensure class time is spent on learning. Plus, we will take safety and medical concerns into account so all risks are minimized."

Schools and school divisions will implement updated policies as students head back to school in September to ensure consistency across the province, which include:

- banning cellphone use during school hours, including lunch and breaks, for students in kindergarten to Grade 8:
- banning cellphone use for students in grades 9 to 12 during class time, with cellphone use permitted during breaks and lunch; and

clear direction for cellphone use in classrooms for school staff.

Guidelines will include exceptions to support students with medical and diverse learning needs, as well as cellphone use for educational purposes in grades 9 to 12 when directed by classroom teachers.

"Our school implemented cellphone restrictions last school year that did not allow students to use cellphones during class time," Evan Janzen Roth, senior years mathematics teacher and department head, Collège Sturgeon Heights Collegiate. "Students were allowed to use cellphones on their breaks. I have noticed that with these restrictions in place, when students would finish work or assessments early, it has given them the opportunity to read more books or engage more with their peers and teachers. The restrictions have also increased students focus without the distraction of their phones. It has been really nice that the cellphone policy was school wide so that everyone had the same expectations, and it was quite easy to implement because of that."

Under the Public Schools Act, school divisions are required to establish use of technology policies tailored to local needs, the minister noted.


