Sept 1 15 Partly Sunny Chartier may be more of a well known name in the hockey arena, but it's in the rodeo arena where Ada and Andi Chartier proving themselves. are Daughters of Christian and Adrienne Chartier (granddaughters of JP/Louise Chartier, Myrtle Lane/Wes Scantlebury and Greg Lane) have had a love for horses since they were babies. This love stems mostly from their Mom's background with horses and much of the Lane side of the family making a living training and riding horses in community pastures.

While Andi Chartier has a few buckles under her belt, Ada Chartier has been working hard and competing with a goal of winning a belt buckle for the past few years...her day finally came in August, when she won not one, but two buckles at a barrel racing/pole bending series in Rossburn Manitoba. She, along with her horse, Tazz, and her sister's horse, Rascal, won both the youth pole bending buckle and the open pole bending buckle!

Both Ada and Andi compete in Manitoba High School Rodeo in barrel racing, pole bending, breakaway roping and

Andi in goat tying. Last season in Junior High division, Andi made it to Nationals in Des Moines Iowa where she competed against the top cowgirls from 5 countries. At Canadian Finals this summer, Andi wound up in 4th place in Canada in breakaway roping!

Now both girls compete in the Senior High division and they are giving each other a run for their money!-particularly

in barrel racing! Ada is currently sitting in first place on the season leader board, with Andi on her heels in second place, followed by approximately 30 other contestants from across Manitoba, eastern Saskatchewan and northern North Dakota.

Another highlight from summer was when both sisters managed to make the top 5 at the semi pro level of rodeo held in Virden in August, which is quite a feat when competing against some of the top competitors from across Western Canada. Andi and Rascal finished in second place at the short go Sunday in Virden.

Ada and Andi work hard at it and do a lot of riding from early spring through to late fall. They would like to send a special thank you to the Bridgeman families at Binscarth for helping them come along with roping and for having the pleasure of getting to ride a couple of their good horses.



Manitoba Government Expands Security Rebate Funding

Security Rebate Program Increasing by \$1.5 Million to Help More Homeowners, Renters, and Small Businesses: Premier

The Manitoba government is increasing the Manitoba Security Rebate Program by \$1.5 million to help more Manitobans save money on cameras, security systems, and other equipment, Premier Wab Kinew and Justice Minister Matt Wiebe announced today.

"Manitobans should be safe in their homes and communities, and having a camera or an alarm can help with that," said Kinew. "We've had a great response from Manitoba families and businesses over the summer, which is why we're expanding the rebate so we can lower the cost of security equipment for more people."

Launched in June, the program offers a \$300 rebate to homeowners, renters and small business owners for purchasing security equipment. Originally announced as part of Budget 2024 with a total of \$500,000 in rebates available to the public, the program's overall budget for this rebate program is being expanded to \$2 million.

"After seeing such high interest from Manitobans, our government is increasing the total amount of funding for security rebates so that more homeowners, renters and small business owners can save money on security measures such as cameras, lights and other products designed to help keep properties safe," said Wiebe. "This is one part of our plan to make communities across Manitoba safer."

The rebate is designed to offset the cost of security improvements for Manitoba homeowners, renters and small business owners. Eligible upgrades include security cameras, doorbell cameras, alarm systems, motion detectors, reinforced doors or windows, antigraffiti film and paints, security gates, roll-down protection shutters and permanent security fencing.

Limited space is available in the program, and so Manitobans planning to apply should do so as soon as possible, the minister noted. Applications are reviewed on a first-come, first-served basis and the program will be closed when it reaches \$2 million in applications. Rebates for those who have already applied are beginning to roll out this week and will continue to be processed over the coming weeks.

Any purchase made after Sept. 1, 2023, is eligible to receive the rebate. The rebate can cover multiple expenses for a single property or business under the \$300 threshold as long as they are submitted in a single application. Manitobans with multiple homes or business locations in the province are only eligible to apply once for one location. Ongoing subscriptions or monthly fees for existing security systems are not eligible and only equipment associated with a new security system is covered by the rebate.


