



Electric Vehicle Safety for First Responders

On February 1st 2026 West Central Mutual Aid District held a regional training day at the Birtle Fire Hall. We had 27 firefighters representation 9 fire departments attending from our district.

The presentation was done by Kevin Patterson, training officer from the Banff Fire Department. Kevin is a 25 year member of the fire service and travels Western Canada presenting information on Electric Vehicle Safety and Electric Vehicle Extrication.

He works closely with the Tesla Engineers and with Lithium Ion battery testing companies. As you can see he has a wealth of knowledge on electric vehicles.

Our day consisted of classroom presentation followed by a tour of the Tesla car and its components. We covered the batteries and charging process as well as why they sometimes fail and cause fires. We covered the cooling and extinguishing efforts that we can use to reduce damaged caused by electric vehicle fires, this included the safety side of the water application on the electrical systems on board.

Another area that we looked at was the vehicle construction and the different types of materials used to strengthen the vehicles making vehicle extrication much more difficult. The standard location for the high voltage lines that run through the vehicles as well as access points to disconnect the battery system from the rest of the car.

Overall it was a very informative day for most of us it was our first introduction to an inside look at working with electric vehicles. We can now approach an Electric Vehicle incident with more safety for the firefighter and occupants of the vehicle.

WHAT'S HAPPENING

at the **BIRDTAIL COUNTRY MUSEUM**

THIS WINTER?

Get ready to explore the whole, newly renovated and curated second floor of the museum. We will open on July 1st and thereafter Tuesday to Saturday 1-5pm. We hope that opening on Saturdays will make the museum more accessible for families looking for something to do at the weekends.

Although the three rooms upstairs have already been beautifully renovated there are still some improvements to be made. The stairway to the second floor will be repaired and insulated on the west wall. The three windows on the west wall and the door to the summer kitchen will be replaced so that all will be winter proof.

In addition, major repairs are taking place in the museum's basement. The south east corner will be shored up with a new cement wall which will stabilize the foundation for the future. In the same area, new floor joists will be installed. In the spring, some regrading of the area around the museum will redirect moisture away from the building.

When this foundation/basement repair is completed there will be two more major repair/restoration projects. A) Pulling off the parging on the east wall (where it is currently and alarmingly bulging) and the north wall where it is cracked and peeling (2027) B) Repairing the stone work around the south west window and repairing the stone/ wood framing where the giant rocks fell out years ago (2028)

These major repairs will give the heritage building a new lease on life. Many thanks to the support from the Prairie View Municipal Foundation, the Manitoba Heritage Resources Conservation Grant, The Birtle and District Foundation, the Birtle Lions Club and the Birtle Value Shoppe who have supported this project faithfully and generously.

Please don't hesitate to call. If I am unable to assist, I have a list of names and numbers that I can direct you to.





HOLISTIC HIGHLIGHTS

Small Imbalances, Big Effects: Minerals in the Body

Things like chronic stress, illness, heavy sweating, fasting or drinking very pure water (such as reverse osmosis) without remineralizing can all exasperate mineral deficiency.

The body knows what it needs and will often show you, sometimes we just need to learn to listen. So take a quiet moment to check in with your body. What do you notice? What do you feel? Supporting mineral balance can invite relaxation, calm the nervous system, and restore resilience.


