





This spring and summer the Birdtail Country Museum has been working on developing our display about the Birtle Indian Residential School. This is still a work in progress, with some very interesting developments in the works.

We now have a TV set up to play photos taken at the residential school over the years. Included with the photos are the stories of three survivors from the school, and the grand-daughter of a former staff member. These stories are also available through QR codes and accessible with any smartphone.

The first story, Bimibatoo-Win (Where I Ran), is that of Charlie Bittern, and

tells the story of how the Birtle Residential School principal forced him to run in front of his car in a blizzard for 80 kilometres along Number 1 highway in Manitoba.

The second story, Run as One, details the story of four Birtle Residential School students who were selected, along with six students from other residential schools in Manitoba, to carry the Olympic torch during the Pan Am Games in 1967. They ran from Minneapolis to Winnipeg, but when they arrived at the stadium they were not allowed to bring the torch in.

The third and fourth stories tell the experiences of Birtle Residential School survivors Percy Ballantyne and Arthur Fourstar, as told to the Legacy of Hope Foundation. The fifth story is that of Sue McLoughlin, granddaughter of Fred Finlay who was employed as an engineer at Birtle Residential School.

Birdtail Country Museum has been in touch with Charlie Bittern and Percy Ballantyne, and with Sue McLoughlin and Darla Fourstar, the daughter of the late Arthur Fourstar, to request permission to include their stories in our display. We have also met in person with Charlie Bittern, Percy Ballantyne, and Terry Wasteste, another survivor of BRS, to show them our display so far, and ask their

opinion on it and on future developments. We plan to continue to work closely with them. Sue McLoughlin and Darla Fourstar have also visited the museum.

In addition the museum continues to partner with our Community Liaison Researcher, Kayleigh Tanner, on the ongoing project "Working Together to Tell our Stories". Kayleigh is working on gathering and recording the stories and memories of community members from Waywayseecappo and Birdtail Sioux First Nations, particularly those who attended Birtle Residential School, and researching the history of Residential Schools.

Our overall goal with



these projects is to promote reconciliation by telling stories of Indigenous history and experience, and to share these with visitors to the museum. Our goal is to display an engaging, multi-media exhibition of this complex part of Birtle's history.


