

During his visit, Shoalts will discuss his legendary journeys and his latest book,







How to make a Home Fire Escape Plan










- Draw a floor plan or a map of your home. Show all **doors** and **windows**.
- Mark two ways out of each room.
- Mark all of the **smoke alarms** with SA. Smoke alarms should be in each sleeping room, outside each sleeping area, and on every level of the home.
- Pick a family **meeting place** outside where everyone can meet.
- Remember, practice your plan at least twice a year!




Grown-ups: Children don't always wake up when the smoke alarm sounds. Know what your child will do before a fire occurs. For more fire safety resources, visit **sparky.org** and **sparkyschoolhouse.org**.



- Draw a map of your home. Show all doors and windows.
- Visit each room. Find two ways out.
- All windows and doors open easily. You should be able to use them to get outside.
- Make sure your home has smoke alarms. Push the test button to make sure each alarm is working.
- Pick an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home where everyone should meet.
- The house or building number can be seen from the street.
- Your plan should meet the needs of all family members, including those with sensory or physical disabilities.
- Make sure everyone in your home knows how to dial 9-1-1.
- Practice your home fire drill at least twice a year with everyone in the household, including guests. Practice at least once during the day and at night.

Petition on Rumble Strips in Birtle

Some Birtle residents have raised concerns regarding the new rumble strips installed on PTH 83 at the intersection of PTH 42. While the intention behind these upgrades was to enhance road safety, the resulting noise and vibration have created unexpected challenges for those living nearby.

Residents report that the rumble strips are exceptionally loud and forceful, with vibrations that can be felt inside homes — disrupting sleep and daily routines. The issue has prompted members of the community to start a petition to Manitoba Transportation and Infrastructure, requesting a review of the installation.

The petition emphasizes that safety and community comfort can go hand in hand, and calls for:

- A reassessment of the rumble strip design and placement.
- Consideration of quieter, alternative safety measures.
- Open dialogue between Manitoba Transportation and local residents.

The goal is not to oppose safety improvements, but to ensure that they work for both drivers and residents.

Community members hope a collaborative review will lead to a solution that maintains road safety while restoring peace and quiet to nearby homes.

The petition is located at Birtle Pharmacy.


