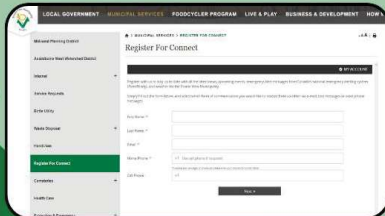

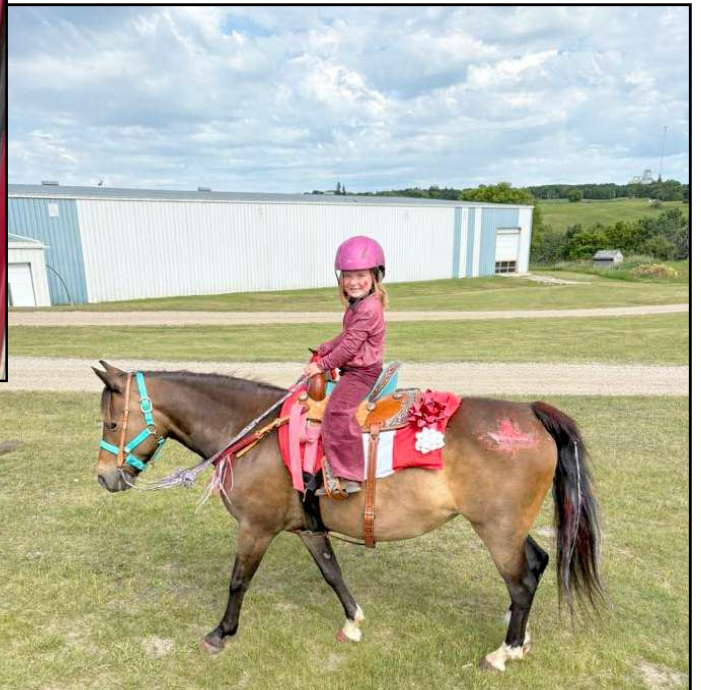

The arts are often overlooked in conversations about economic development, but not in Birtle.

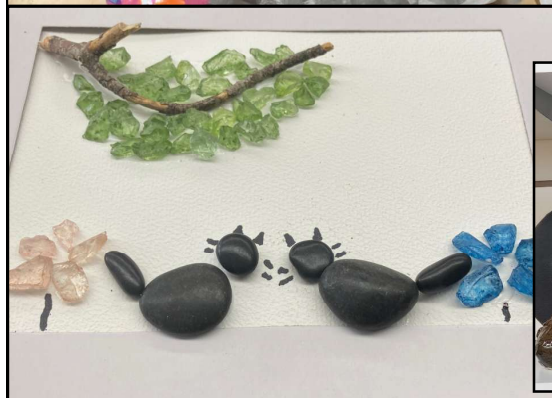

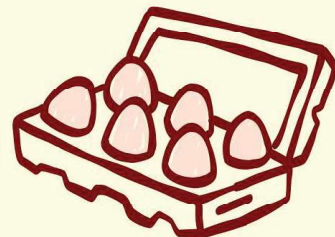

Pat writes: We flew Brandon-Calgary-Whitehorse, Yukon territory where we joined Ruby Range Adventure tours for a bus tour starting on the Alaska Highway. We had overnight stays in Whitehorse, Haines Junction, Yukon, Tok, Valdez, Seward, Anchorage, Healy, Fairbanks, Dawson City and back to Whitehorse. We crossed the Prince William Sound by ferry, with views of Fjords and glaciers along the Pacific Coast. Seward is famous for the nearby Kenai Fjords National Park where we took a motorboat tour and saw whales, sea lions, waterfalls and glaciers. After leaving Anchorage, we travelled to Denali National Park, where Denali (Mount MCKinley), the highest peak in North America is located. In a tour of the park, we saw caribou, moose, fox, and marmot. From Fairbanks (320 km) south of the Arctic Circle) to Dawson City, we travelled the Top of the World Highway. Dawson City was the epicenter of the Klondike gold rush of 1898. From here we travelled the Dempster highway to Tombstone Territorial Park where the Arctic tundra begins. This gravel highway built on solid permafrost is Canada's only link by road to Inuvik, 738 km away. Now back to Whitehorse via the Klondike highway with many glimpses of the Yukon river. Our last day was spent

on a scenic train ride to the seaport of Skagway.

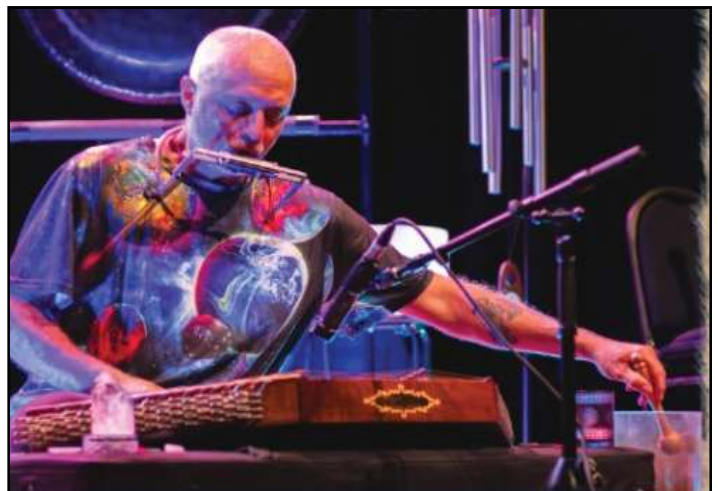

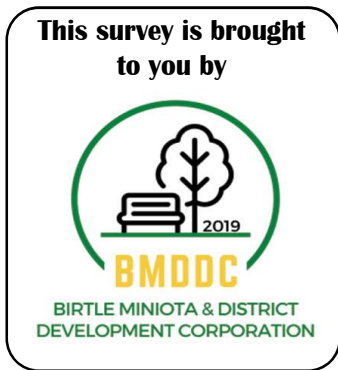
