MANITOBA AUTHOR FINDS BIRTH FAMILY AFTER 55YRS


"The Missing Puzzle Pieces: Finding TIME ENDS My Birth Family"

> Have you ever been in a public place and observed someone who looked like you and wondered to yourself "Could this woman be my mother?"? For the vast majority of the population, this scenario would never happen. For those individuals who are adopted and have not found their birth family, this can be a common occurrence. Not knowing their birth mother and/or father can cause an individual to experience a gap in their understanding as to who they are as a person, who their birth family members are and where their family from. came

> Knowing she was adopted from age three, when she went with her parents to select her new baby brother at the Child and Family Services building, Joan believed that all babies were simply chosen by new parents. She spent her early years living with her adoptive parents, Ron and Helen Hudson, on a dairy farm in Rosser Municipality. Her dad and her uncle farmed together and her two cousins were also adopted. Adoption was the norm for

her as a young child.

Joan's adopted mother was Helen Sutcliffe and was raised in the Rothesay area on a farm just southeast of Birtle. Joan describes the many life lessons she learned from mother her



including the importance of keeping alive connections with older neighbors, friends and family. She shares her memories of times spent visiting with the Curtis and Dickey families in Birtle as well as visiting their relatives in England and North Ireland.

Joan's book, The Missing Puzzle Pieces: Finding My Birth Family, is an exploration of strategies adopted children and adults can employ when seeking their heritage by finding their birth parents. Her story is a tribute to

Joan's loving adoptive family for preparing her to deal with unforeseeable life challenges as she meets her new birth family.

As you read her book, a remarkable number of coincidences or Godwinks are revealed in the journey finding her roots. One amazing Godwink involved meeting a woman at a house party in Tucson, Arizona who grew up two doors down the street from Joan's birth family in Ochre River, MB. Her journey to find information about her birth family was truly a work of revelations and wonder.

Joan Zaretsky has been an educator for over 45 years in many different educational capacities. She completed her Bachelor of Home Economics degree in the Family Studies cohort with Geraldine Fitzgerald of Birtle. Joan went on to receive a Doctoral degree in Inclusive Special Education. She has written and presented research papers across North America. This memoir is her first book written passionately from her heart rather than her research findings.

3.To Purchase a new BBQ for Activities/Sunny-side Manor at the Birtle Health Centre.



This story began back in 1940 when several young Miniota men enlisted in the army at the beginning of World War 2. Those men who were placed in the same regiment were Les Bryant, Jim Ewing, Jack Hanlin, Mel McKenzie, and Lloyd Oliver. The story of this docudrama tells of members of this group finding a young 5 year old boy. They basically adopted him and kept him safe for nearly a year until Gino was discovered by the higher ups of the military, and the men were ordered to place him in an orphanage prior to their moving camp. Les Bryant and Lloyd Oliver took it upon themselves to place Gino with an Italian family they knew. Years later Lloyd and Beth Oliver tracked down Gino, now an adult, and they stayed in touch with Gino and his family. Gino made a trip years later to Canada to meet these Canadian soldiers and their families. A wonderful warm hearted story which was well received by the audience. Attending this event from Calgary where the film was made were the director Robert Curtin and the executive producer Tony Battista. As well the actor Barry Porter who played Lloyd Oliver in his later years was in attendance along with his aunt Martha Hodkinson. Also Dina Aretti and family members from Brandon came to be acknowledged for Dina's role in translating many letters between the Olivers and Gino through the years. Because of the importance of this story to the families of the five Miniota men, each of these men were represented on Friday evening: Les Bryant by his daughter Myrna and Cam Schweitzer and granddaughter Regan and Marc Simard; Jack Hanlin by his children David, Janet and Rita and their spouses; Mel McKenzie by his son Chris McKenzie from Okotoks AB and Lloyd Oliver by his children Dennis, Brian, Darcy, and Julia and their children and grandchildren. As well Mert Massey a member of this regiment who was key in this story was represented by two nephews, Bill and Rob who came from Ninette MB. The Oliver family hosted a supper for those who had come from a distance. Linda Clark acted as MC for the evening, giving the background story prior to viewing the movie. As well the Birtle Legion #55 was in attendance and Legion Member John Stowe led us in the Legion service. The Miniota Community Centre was on hand to provide refreshments. Darcy and his children Amanda, Ted and Tanya travelled to Italy this past summer for the first viewing of the docudrama and a visit with Gino and his family. It has now been viewed in Calgary and Winnipeg and will be shown in Toronto in April. The producers continue to work to have it shown in more areas. Indeed we as a community were so pleased to be placed on the circuit of premiers, as the story began here in Miniota with five of our soldiers.

As we know our Canadian soldiers are held in high esteem for their acts of kindness and bravery in many European towns. Having just seen Gino- A Child of War and hearing the Legion words, may we all remember that Remembrance Day is approaching. "We will remember them. Lest We Forget". 


