

#### CALLY'S CLIPPERS takes over MISSED-A-BIT


The kennel and grooming service north of Miniota is continuing with new owner Callaghan Glass Anne DavisonApr 12, 2024 8:00 AM

Although Lorraine Rees has sold her thriving dog grooming and kennel business, dogs and cats and their owners will continue to be served by a new entrepreneur at that location. Callaghan Glass (Cally) operates Cally's Clippers & Kennels and is happy to be taking over the well-established business just minutes north of Miniota.

Glass is a dog owner who has been grooming for some years and working under Rees, so the opportunity to buy the business when Missed-A-Bit needed to close was a timely opportunity for both parties.

Just under a decade ago, Lorraine Rees established Missed-A-Bit on their farm property at the junction Rd 81 North and Hwy 83, four miles north of Miniota. Her business quickly became a going concern. Dog groomers are few and far between in rural Westman, and kennels even more so.

Rees had years of experience and

knew how to work with dogs. She was kept very busy.

But nearing their retirement years, Lorraine and her husband Eion Rees began to deal with health issues and knew it was time to make some changes, "to have some me time," Lorraine said. And that is what the couple is doing, moving from their Miniota property to an acreage in southwestern Manitoba.

As things unfolded with their busy dog service, Lorraine found she

needed a capable employee. To her surprise, a neighbour filled the bill.

"I come from just six miles up the road," says Glass with a bright smile. She took over the reins of the grooming and kennel business with her first day on March 23.

Originally from Winnipeg, Cally and her husband lain are residents of Prairieview Municipality. With two little dogs of her own that required regular grooming, Glass found that Lorraine at Missed-A-Bit was her go-to groomer.

She began working with Rees over the past couple of years. With her interest in dogs, and her experience grooming her own, Glass was who she called on.

Rees said, "I took her on to do my dog kennels and when I had appointments, she stood in for me. She knows what she's doing."

Reese is very pleased to see her business go to someone with experience and love for the work. "I think a home-based business is good," says Rees. "You can work it around your kids, your personal appointments," she says.

Glass agrees, saying she is happy to be her own boss, responsible for her own business.

Callaghan and Iain have seven children, Addison, Duncan, Isla, Logan, Alice, Sophie and toddler Jasper. The older kids enjoy working around the kennels and happily pitch in when they aren't in school.

Glass is still operating under the Missed-A-Bit Facebook page where she greets customers saying, "We are both very excited for this new chapter in our lives. Can't wait to meet you all and I hope to continue to give you the same level of

#### C. CLIFFORD LOUGHEED

April 12, 1928 - November 21, 2023

Cliff passed away, peacefully, at his care residence, after a day enjoying visits from his children and grandchildren. Dad was predeceased by Rilla, his loving wife of 65 years, in 2014. With his last words, "I am going to meet my Creator", we had no doubt mom would be the first one waiting for him as he went 'home' to be with Jesus.


Dad is survived by his daughter Jo-Anne (Ian) Seymour, and sons, Kevin, and Scott (Susan) Lougheed as well as grandchildren, Andrew (Andrea) Seymour, Patrick Seymour, and Katie (Konrad) Krahn; Christopher, Nicholas and Caroline Lougheed; and Laura (Adam) Fanset, Darryl (Lindsay) Lougheed, and Paige Lougheed; and eight great-grandchildren. Also fondly remembered by Sandi Lougheed.

Dad was predeceased by his wife, Aurilla, his parents, Oliver and Maud Lougheed, and both sisters, Olive and Connie. He leaves behind many nieces and nephews with great memories of "Uncle Spud".

Cliff met Rilla Barnes on a lunch break from his first job with the Royal Bank in Birtle, MB. After a lot of convincing on dad's part, they were married on June 15, 1949.

Dad was born in Foxwarren, Manitoba, and came from a once well off, but later experiencing hard times, farming family. Dad often told the tale of how his father, Ollie, after several good harvests, undertook building a large modern farmhouse for Maud, which was completed right at the beginning of the Depression. His father eventually had to surrender the farm to the Royal Bank. The family ended up converting a chicken coop into what was to be a temporary home, and his father found employment as a short haul trucker to make ends meet, but times stayed hard, and the family never left it. With bedrooms tacked on for a growing family, a cold-water hand pump, wood stove, and an outdoor "biffy", this was dad's "homestead"! One can understand dad's cautious approach to money, since those who never had it growing up tend to value it more.

Despite hard times and humble beginnings, Cliff still had a lot of fun growing up. He often recalled his teenage hockey exploits, as a mere 16-year-old goalie, backstopping the Foxwarren team to the 1945, and in his last year, the 1948 Junior B Championships. Dad, self-taught, played drums in a band, traveling many miles to places like Wasagaming's Danceland to play all night for \$5.00, considered good money in those days. Despite late nights playing swing music, and long hockey bus rides, he graduated Grade 12 with Honours and joined the Royal Bank, ironically the same bank that took the deed to the farm, where he had an accomplished and distinguished career, respected by his peers and customers alike. Dad always gave others on his team most of the credit, which is why his staff really loved and respected him. Dad took early retirement at age 59 to fulfil his dream of starting his own business, Lougheed & Associates.

Dad was not all work. He and mom travelled to Hawaii, the UK, eastern and western seaboards, many parts of the USA and Canada, often with family and close friends.

Grandpa Lougheed was greatly loved by all the family, and we shall miss him very much.

We are grateful to the staff at the Arbours, Brightwater Linden Pointe. Cliff was one of their favourite residents, and their care and compassion helped him, and us, through his last days.






