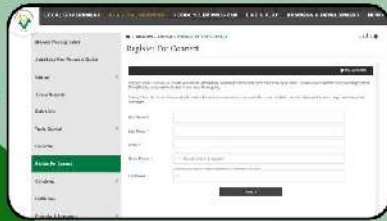

# Manitoba Arts Council Makes a Difference in Birtle

Established in 1965, the Manitoba Arts Council (MAC) is Manitoba's public arts funder, supporting the creation and sharing of arts and culture for the benefit of all Manitobans. Funded by the Government of Manitoba through the Department of Sport, Culture, Heritage, and Tourism, MAC provides funding and services to a wide range of individuals and organizations in the arts and culture sector. The support of MAC enables ongoing, sustainable programming that contributes to the arts and cultural sustenance of individuals and communities across the province.

Over the past 11 years, the Birtle Center for the Arts (BCA) evolved into a fully functioning arts center powered largely by volunteer energy and local financial support. 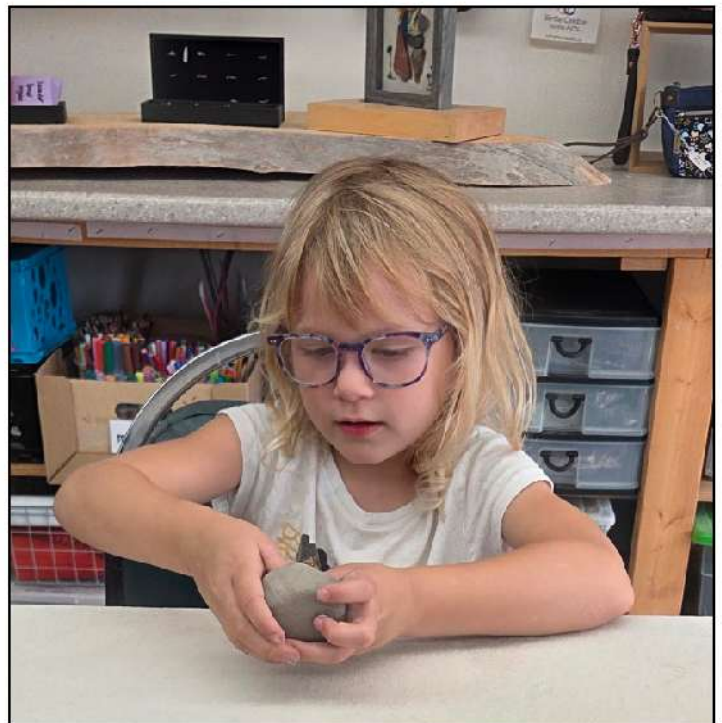

# BIRTLE & AREA PALLIATIVE CARE

Living with a life-limiting illness is difficult. Difficult to understand and difficult to talk about. It is overwhelming and confusing. Birtle & Area Palliative Care Committee began about 15 years ago to help those facing this terrible reality and has been actively helping people in need ever since.

Working under Prairie Mountain Health guidelines, the committee remains focused on providing support to Palliative patients and their families in the Birtle area. We can help access available resources and trained volunteers can provide emotional support and personal companionship in both health care facilities and at home, with empathy and confidentiality. No one needs to face this alone.

Access to the Palliative Care program is not difficult. Anyone diagnosed with a life-limiting illness that cannot be cured is eligible. Talk to your Health provider and ask them to complete a referral, which is then sent to a member of the Prairie Mountain Health Palliative Care Team. You will then be contacted to discuss your care planning. Once this is done, the local Palliative Care Committee is notified and will contact you. (Information is easily available on the Prairie Health web site under Programs and Services, Palliative Care.) There is no cost to this program.

Birtle & Area Palliative Care Committee has given financial assistance to individuals and to local and nearby health care facilities for the purchase of needed medical equipment. In the past, the committee has furnished and stocked a private Palliative Care room and family room at the Birtle Health Center, furnished a room where agency nurses

could stay and contributed to a crib at the Russell Hospital. At present, we are supporting the Birtle Sunnyside Manor "Sponsor a Door" initiative, whereby all residents will have a welcoming door to their 'home'.

Local projects for local people done by a volunteer committee - that is the Birtle Palliative Care Committee.

With the onset of colder weather, I wanted to put out a few reminders...

### Winter Safety Tips for Seniors

#### Staying Safe and Healthy During the Cold Season

Winter in Canada can be beautiful, but it also brings unique challenges, especially for seniors. Ensuring safety during cold months is essential for maintaining health and independence. Here are some key tips for seniors to stay safe this winter.

#### Dress Appropriately

Layer up with warm clothing such as a toque, scarf, mittens, and waterproof boots. Wearing several

light layers is better than one bulky sweater, as layers provide better insulation. Always cover exposed skin to prevent frostbite.

#### Prevent Slips and Falls

Sidewalks and driveways can be icy and hazardous. Use ice melt or sand for traction, and consider wearing boots with non-slip soles. Walk slowly and take shorter steps. If possible, ask someone to clear your walkway or use community services designed for seniors.

#### Keep Warm Indoors


Set your thermostat to at least 20°C and check for drafts around windows and doors. If using space heaters, keep them away from flammable materials and never leave them unattended. Make sure smoke and carbon monoxide detectors are working.

#### Prepare for Emergencies

Have an emergency kit with a flashlight, batteries, bottled water, and non-perishable food. Keep a list of important phone numbers by the phone, including family, doctor, and local ABM locations in case you need cash for emergencies.

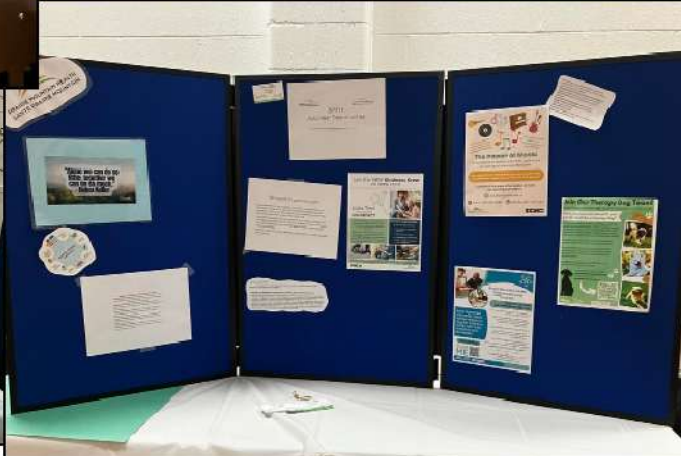
